JANUARY, 2024 REPORT

School Reopen

School resumes for the Second term of the academic year on the 8th day of January, 2024. Attendance on the reopening day was very poor. There was the rumour that reopening was extended by a week and many parents could not verify the right date of reopening. Notwithstanding, a good number of children came to school on the second day after having heard from friends that school is reopened.



Cleaning and arranging of the various classrooms started on the first day of school resumption and continued through the second to the third day. Head teacher asked the teachers to concentrate on the cleaning and arranging of the classrooms so that normal classroom activities could begin on Thursday and allow the general cleaning to be done later.





Mamprulli (L1) Training

It was in one Advisory Council (AC) meeting that the head teacher of LLC, Mr. Majeed Salifu reported that the teaching and learning of Mamprulli (L1) in LLC has been reduced. A concerned parent asked why the teaching and learning of L1 is reduced since that has been a good way of laying a better foundation for the children. The answer was that, many of the current teachers have not received any formal training in the teaching of L1 as was done to previous teachers. It was decided that a training session on L1 be organised for all teachers. A committee was immediately constituted to source for resource personnel, materials and schedule a time for the training.



In consultation with teachers, it was agreed that a 4 day period for each term be spared for the training and the first one was slated for the 3rd to 6th of January, 2024. The 4 days workshop took place at LLC during the vacation period.



The resource persons, Mr. Ben Bukari and Mr. John Yakubu who were engaged in previous training sessions, were decided on, consulted and they agreed to support in the training.

The main agenda for the training was to help teachers to be able present lessons in the Mamprulli to the children and ensure that such lessons are well understood. Children should be able to read, write and understand the local language as much as possible.



Facilitators made various presentations and teachers were put in groups to discuss, practice and make presentations on behalf of their groups on chosen topics.

At the end of the training session, the Head teacher thanked the facilitators and teachers and assured that the lessons received shall be put to better use in the classroom.



Jeremie Donates Table Tennis Kits

As indicated earlier on, Jeremie is involved in every game and activity that the school children and the teachers do undertake. He played Table Tennis with the children and developed much interest in playing the game. He went on to purchase and donates a set of Table Tennis kits for the school. The children were happy and immediately mounted the table and started playing with NO or LITTLE rules attached to the game. It was fun and everyone appreciated the gesture.



A visit by Jeremie's family

PAMBE Ghana and the La'angum Learning Centre were fortunate to receive two (2) friendly and charming visitors from Germany, Ellen and Philip (Jeremie's Mum and brother respectively). They came to pay a visit to Jeremie and to visit PAMBE Ghana and the La'angum Learning



Centre. The 2 were taken through the classrooms, interacted with teachers and children, visited the ICT lab and the kitchen. PAMBE Ghana hosted them in the PAMBE Ghana residence for 2 nights. The donation of the Table Tennis kits coincided with the arrival of the 2 visitors. The mother prayed that much more support gets to the children and thanked the teachers for the dedication to duty. She said, "I am a teacher by profession and I know what it takes to handle kids such as these". Ellen was so impressed especially about the material setup and classroom arrangements.

Donation of Furniture to Basic 4 to 6 children

In one of the many meetings and interactions PAMBE Ghana and the La'angum Learning Centre staffs has had with Jeremie, the Programme Director was briefing teachers on the year's budget and Jeremie asked if there was a priority area he could source funds to support. The PD threw the question to the teachers who said there was the need to help furnish the basic 4 and 5 classrooms. Jeremie accepted the challenge and did deliver. Through the fundraiser he had with family and friends, he was able to provide enough furniture to basic 4, 5 and 6.

The programme Director informed the PTA and the Advisory Council chairmen and they organized and received this handsome support on behalf on LLC and PAMBE Ghana



Jeremie also donated teaching and learning materials to the children and teachers of the La'angum Learning Centre (LLC). He's been teaching and supporting in the classrooms for the pass six (6) months and knows which items are consumed quicker and volunteered to support the school by "providing a little to support". The supplies included smaller work books for the Kindergarten and the lower primary, chalk, masking tapes, my clear bags, teaching note books for teachers, pencils, sharpeners and a lot more.



The teaching and learning materials were also received by the PTA and AC representatives and handed to the head teacher's representative. The PTA chair man on behalf of all parents thanked Jeremie, his family and all his friends who supported in any way to make this possible. Jeremie thanked everyone for the love and support that has been given to him and did not forget to thank the Board for accepting him and given permission to the Programme Director to support him with and invitation letter which paved way for his visa applications and entry.

The presentation was done by the PTA and AC representatives on behalf of PAMBE Ghana and the Board of Directors.




