Hepatitis Vaccination for Newly Enrolled Students.

On October 20, 2025, our newly enrolled KG1 students received their first dose of Hepatitis B vaccination. Out of 40 newly enrolled students, 37 were vaccinated, while 13 transfer students also received the vaccine. As you may be aware, the vaccination schedule consist of multiple doses: the second and third doses will be given in the in the following two months, and a booster dose will be administered in the fourth month. The KG1 department held a parent-teacher conference for our new parents, where the teachers took the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the new parents. They discussed the behaviors expected of children in the first plane of development, highlighting that children are capable of learning multiple languages and absorbing both positive and negative influences. Parents were encouraged to assist teachers model the behaviors they expect their children to exhibit, as this stage is crucial for learning. The parents asked questions, shared their experiences and expectations, and expressed gratitude to the teachers, committed to continue paying school fees and food contributions.
